## Its Five in Two for Abell

Rush Green Liverpool Legends

The League Supremes top goalace Sammy Abell extended his tally to 5 for the season already with all 5 coming in the last 2 games.

Grabbing the headlines last week

Abell made it difficult to ignore him again this week when he found the net after only 20 minutes, adding a second merely a minute later. He virtually wrapped the game up just after the half-hour mark when he bagged his hat-trick, the match ball and 3 valuable points.

The Legends made a gallant effort in the second half with Mitch Lough reducing the deficit on 63 minutes but it wasnt enough and Rush Green, Sammy Abell and manager Trevor Isles march on at the top of the table.

The leagues other bad-boys were Sexual Ealing FC. They travelled to the City Ground where there were 3 yellow cards and Ealings Kirk Hammet getting sent off after 76 minutes. Player manager Paul Corrigan getting booked again is surely setting a bad example.

The League will also be looking into the standard of refereeing and will be asking if their no nonsense attitude is contributing to the alarming statistics.

Greatfully there were also TWELVE goals as the league is sure to promise more twists and turns through to the final match day.


