Legends Boss Leaves By Mutual Consent

Liverpool Legends boss Paul Rowe has left the club 'by mutual consent' yesterday. League Supreme bosses have come down hard on Liverpool Legends manager Paul Rowe due to the managers continual absence from the league.

"It is due to unforeseen circumstances that Paul Rowe, the now ex-manager of Liverpool Legends has left the club 'by mutual consent'" a

statement exclaimed. "Mr Rowe has not been sacked but left by mutual agreement. He had struggled to find the dedication needed to run the club in this high profile league."

His inclusion was always controversial, playing his home games abroad didnt help him, his team or the league.

This is likely to send shudders down the backs of several League

Supreme managers and will send out the right signal to existing managers.

"Since its foundation, the league has attracted many interested mangers looking for employment and we already have a waiting list for next season. We hope to employ one of them, sooner rather than later and certainly in place for the next league match on Thursday. We can assure the current managers that the league and the club will get the right man in place." A spokesman said.

The club currently sits at the bottom of the league but we are only 3 to 4 games into the season.

Ironically the club had just got through to the quarter-finals of the OLPC Tournament, knocking out recent league leaders Rush Green.

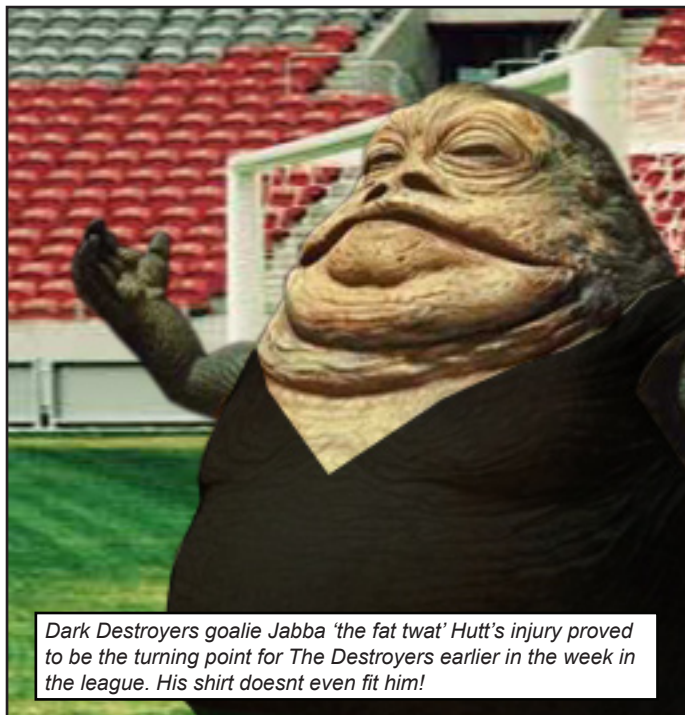

I am tactically brilliant. Unfortunately, we have no luck!!

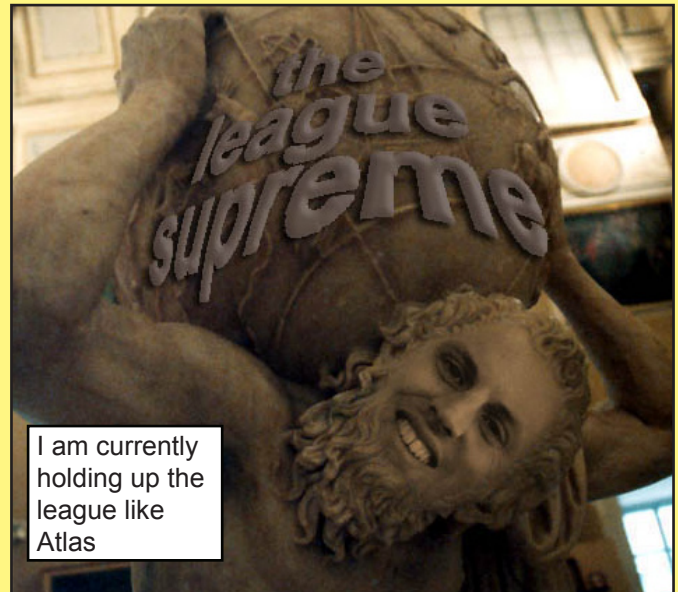
