experience will hold them in good stead for an immediate return back to top flight football.

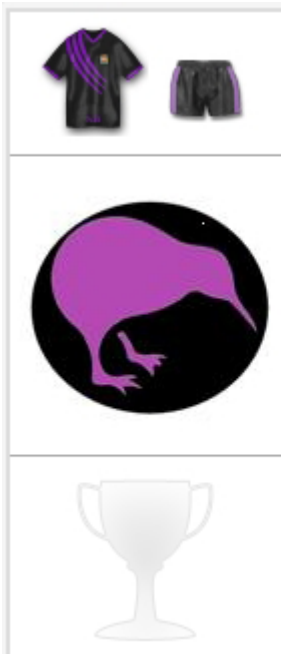

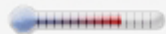

Down Under And Out, outspoken manager has backed up his big mouth by having a storming first season in the Premiership. Breaking into the 'big three' is no mean feat for any club but to do it in your first season in the top flight is even more admirable.

No stranger to controversy and speaking his mind on the press-board Wookie is a manager not to be messed with. His team

are exciting to watch and will always go for a win. Top striker Ben Windsor has proved he can mix it with the big boys and is a striker most managers would have in their squad.

Question marks may appear over an aged, or maybe experienced, midfield which should continue to do well in season four but should be a concern for Wookie long-term. However, long-term is long-term and Wookie is the manager most likely to break, not only into the top three, but will be looking to win the league, even if his surprise (or apparent modesty) in the press board will say otherwise.

In his first 2 seasons Wookie has reached the final and semi-final in the cup, got promoted from division one and finished 3rd in the top flight. A record which all managers will be wary of and have them all secretly looking over their shoulders!

On pre-season signings and in particular goalie Olívio Bonilha Wookie commented "I felt that things had started to stagnate at the club, I've been here for two seasons and done what I can with what was available...but if we are to start to contend then we need some new blood. The Board were behind me and authorised the funds. I've paid 14 million for a young goalie with an unfortunate name. We'll ease him into the team, but we are expecting big things and a long future for him and the club."
