Perries Plan to Sink Park

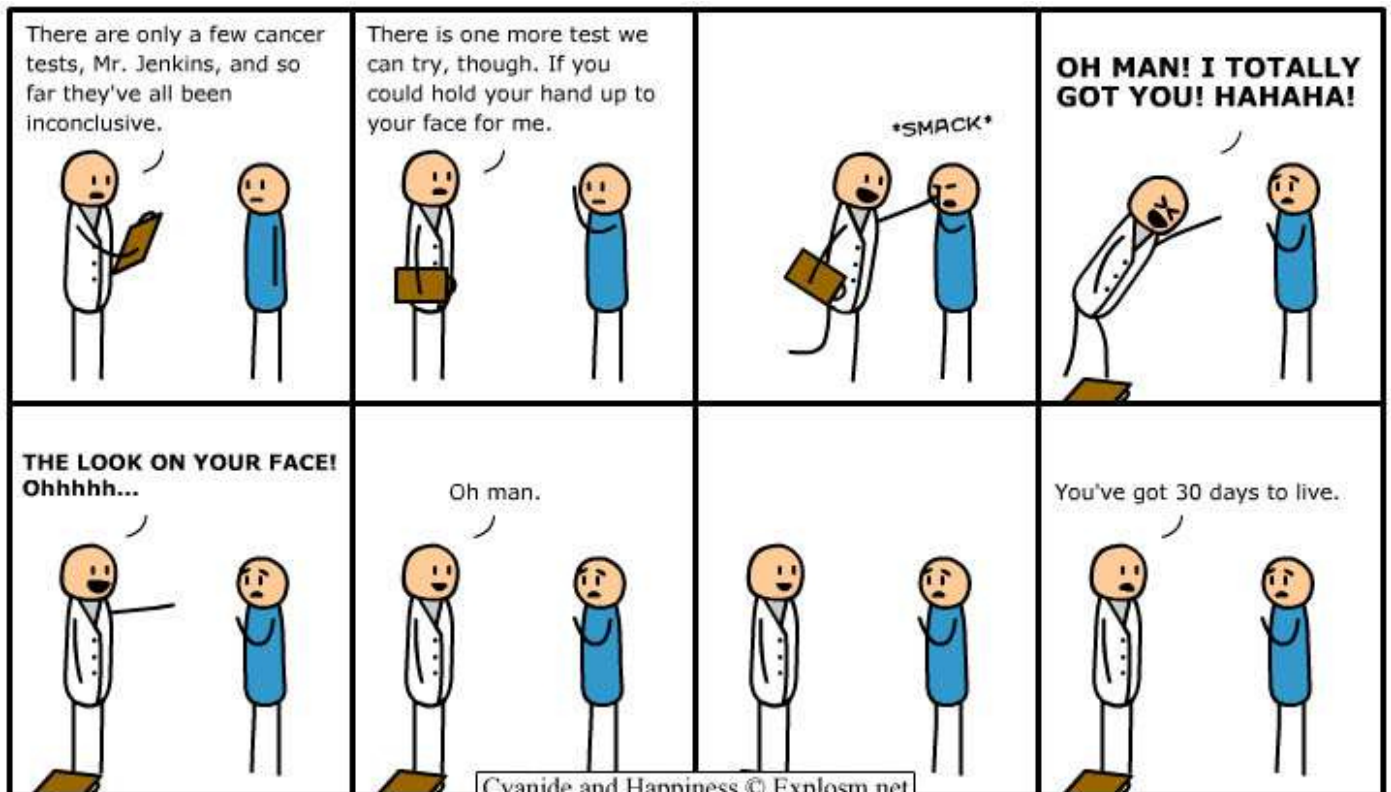
The Perry Men go into the match against

The Gardeners dug deep

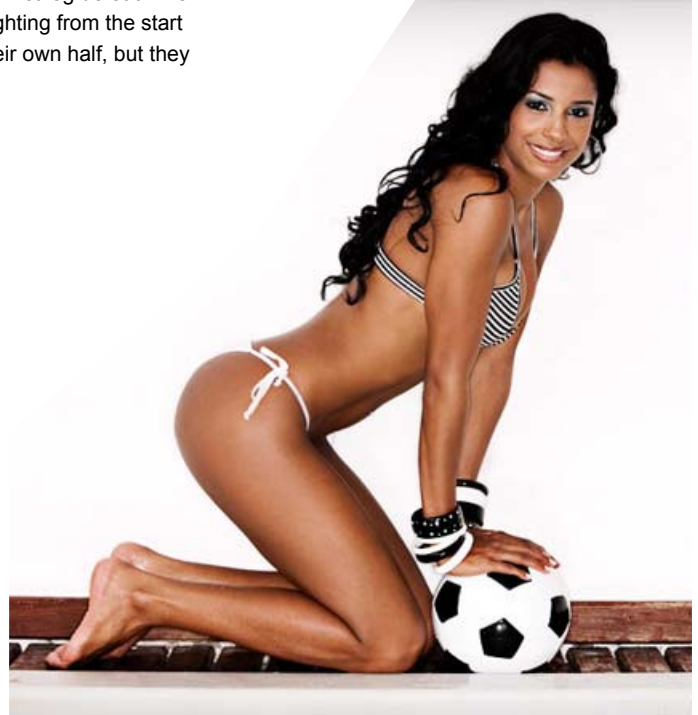
