For all we know this season could be the last for the club if things aren't sorted out quickly and 'Magic' is found soon.

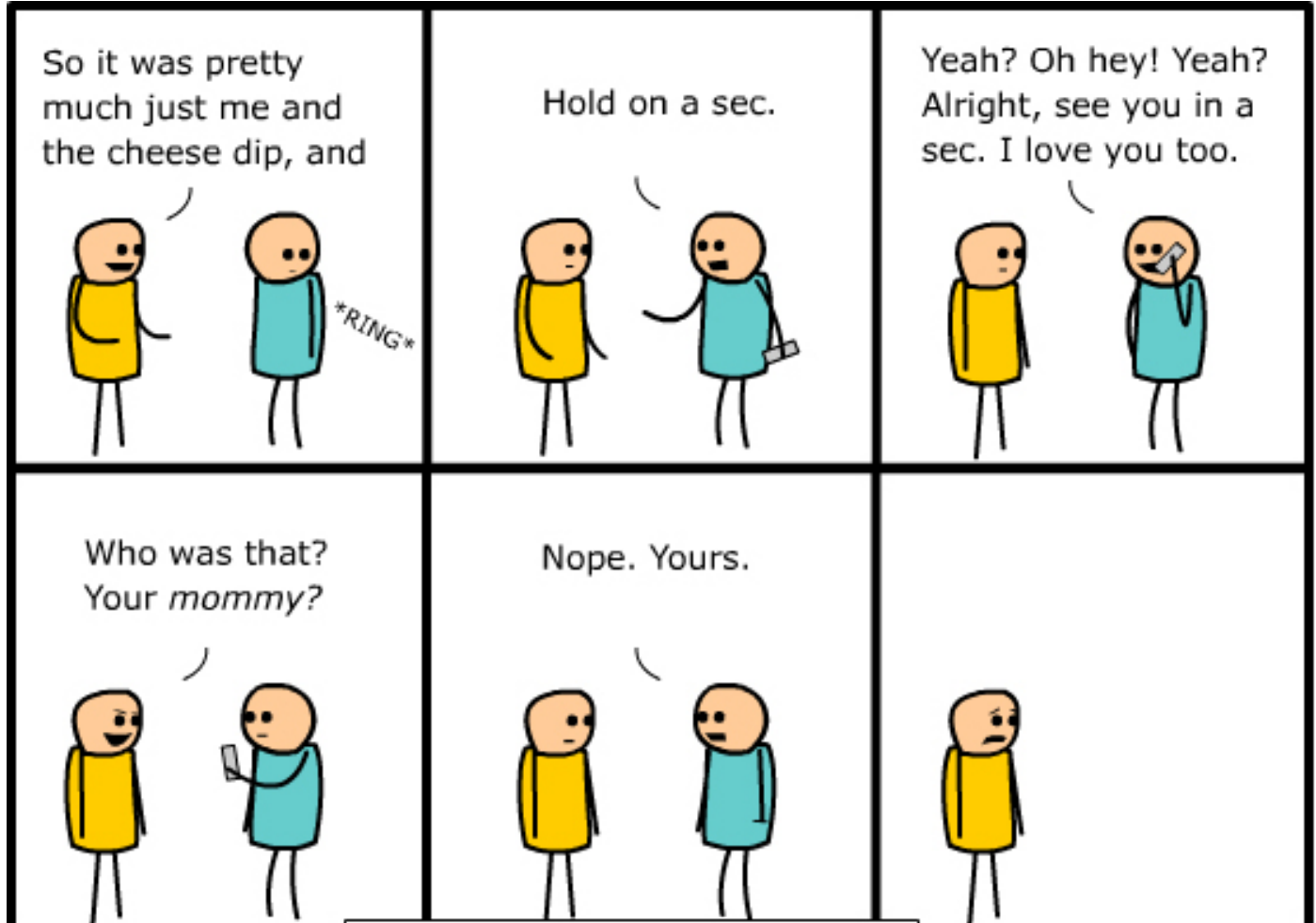
Chieftan looks for Winning Return

Lets see if the Irish side can now go away to Hell Hounds and get their league ambitions back on track.

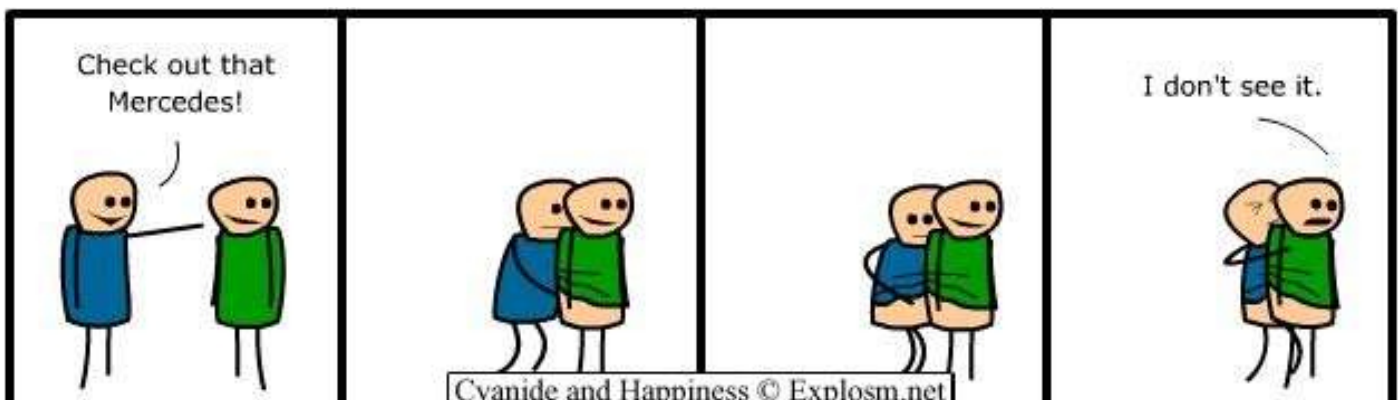
Elsewhere . . .
