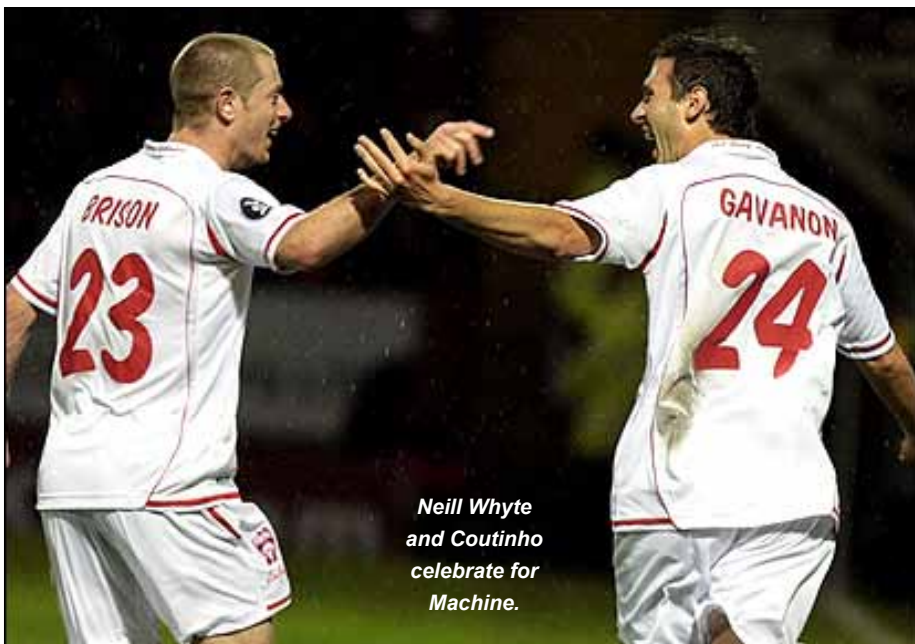




The Red Machine Guarantee Their Premiership Survival

Why You'll Love It:

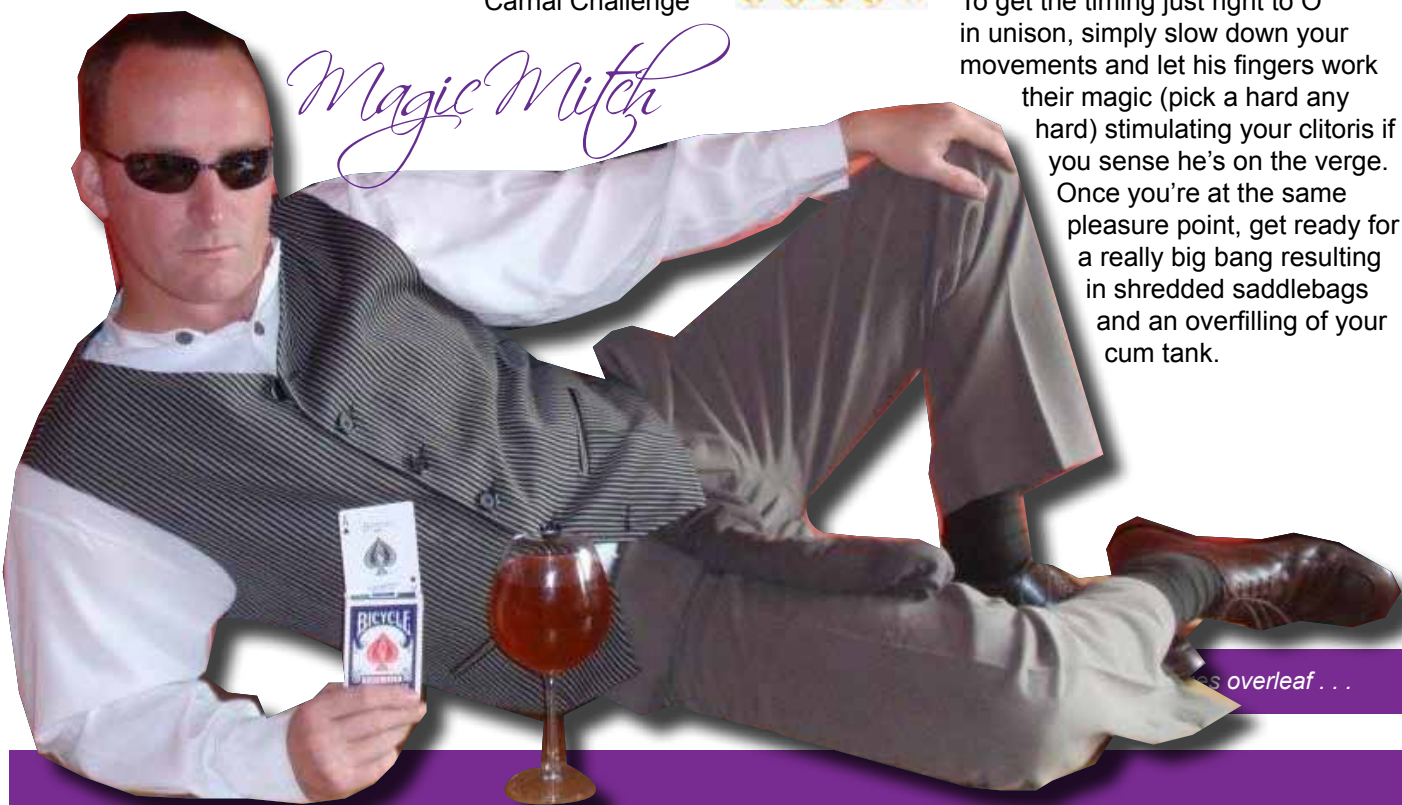
