





interview:

Firstly can you say a few words about today's match?

A job well done. I wanted the league to be won in front of home supporters, so we didn't give Wanderers a chance today. I fielded a full strength side and told the boys to go at em. 5-0 against the second placed team...that result alone could make someone season.

How does it feel to win the League?

It's a great feeling; I don't think I'll be coming back down to ground anytime soon. The whole club has worked so hard for 3 seasons to develop a side that can compete. I took big risks by building up from nothing and the board had the balls to stick with me and now that's paying off big time. The supporters have been just amazing and this has created our fortress at Wookie Hole were we haven't lost a game all season and have won every league game played here.

What is the Key to your success?

Obviously I can't give too much away. But it's clear for all to see that we kept a tight defence all season. It's no secret that I've been building a solid unit at the back for the best part of 3 seasons and they're really functioning well now. Against the best strikers that the premiership has to offer; to only let in 9 goals in 13 games is a testament to just how well they have played. Add to this solid defence the legendary strike partnership of Ben Windsor and Andy Blackmoor, who between them bagged 17 goals this

season, and you can understand how we dominated the league.

What are your thoughts about the opposition you faced this season?

Makes no mistakes, the premiership is a whole different environment than it was a few seasons ago. Back then there was no competition; managers would routinely not turn up or drop out half way through the season and gift points left right and centre. Today, it's tougher, more competitive, the teams are stronger and managers more skilful, dedicated and resourceful. The lads have been in great form throughout, so I'm confident of a great CR report come the close of season. This will put us in an even stronger position to push aside our competition next season. We'll have to wait and see how much the other clubs are willing to spend on the transfer market to get the squads up to our level.

Newly promoted Mangatainoka FC manager Aotearoa has just let his players & supporters aware of


a change of direction the club will be


heading down when the transfer window re-opens, via the following press release






