

The home side improved much in the second half and went close on many occasions but time was not only ticking in the match but also on their Premiership existence, and with the final whistle, it was Temple Town who stayed up and Destroyers who went down, meaning that Red Machine and Egloshayle Park are the only sides to remain in top flight football since the leagues birth.

Essex Fightback concludes dismal season for both

Park let a 3-1 lead slip away in the final 10 minutes against the poorest ever Premiership side Essex Wanderers as they ended the season with 3 points, including a point at Egloshayle Road, completing a dismal season for both sides.

Park started well with Theo Walcott opening the scoring after nine minutes following good work from Diddy Hamilton. Park were 2-0 up after 28 minutes. Anders Svensson putting Alan Shearer through to slot past Irons to make it 2-0 at half-time in an even first half.

Essex came out an improved side in the second half and pulled a goal back ten minutes into the second half. Jasper Tete

scoring direct from a free-kick. Gareth Bale restored Parks two goal buffer when he headed in a Shearer corner. With minutes remaining and Park 3-1 up Essex staged an impressive come-back. Alfie Horridge made it 3-2 from distance after good work from Brent Manger and, with four minutes remaining, Harold Sully set up Tete for his long-range equaliser and second of the match.

Raiders So Close To Runners-Up

Westcountry Wanderers amazing second half of the season demise was complete at the hands of last seasons champions Irish Raiders as they themselves managed a 2-0 away win at the fallen leaders and nearly managed to grab runners up spot. Wanderers, after winning ALL seven of their openers only managed one win, one draw and an amazing five defeats in the 'back seven'.

The visitors dominated possession in the match and had the better of the chances although they were few and far between.

William Kirkby made the pressure pay with a header from a Gary Fortune cross to find the net, but this wasn't until the 53rd minute. Twenty minutes later Raiders doubled their lead, a direct free-kick from Marshall Bushell found the target and completed the 2-0 win.





McGibbon Hattrick The Icing On Disappointing Cake






