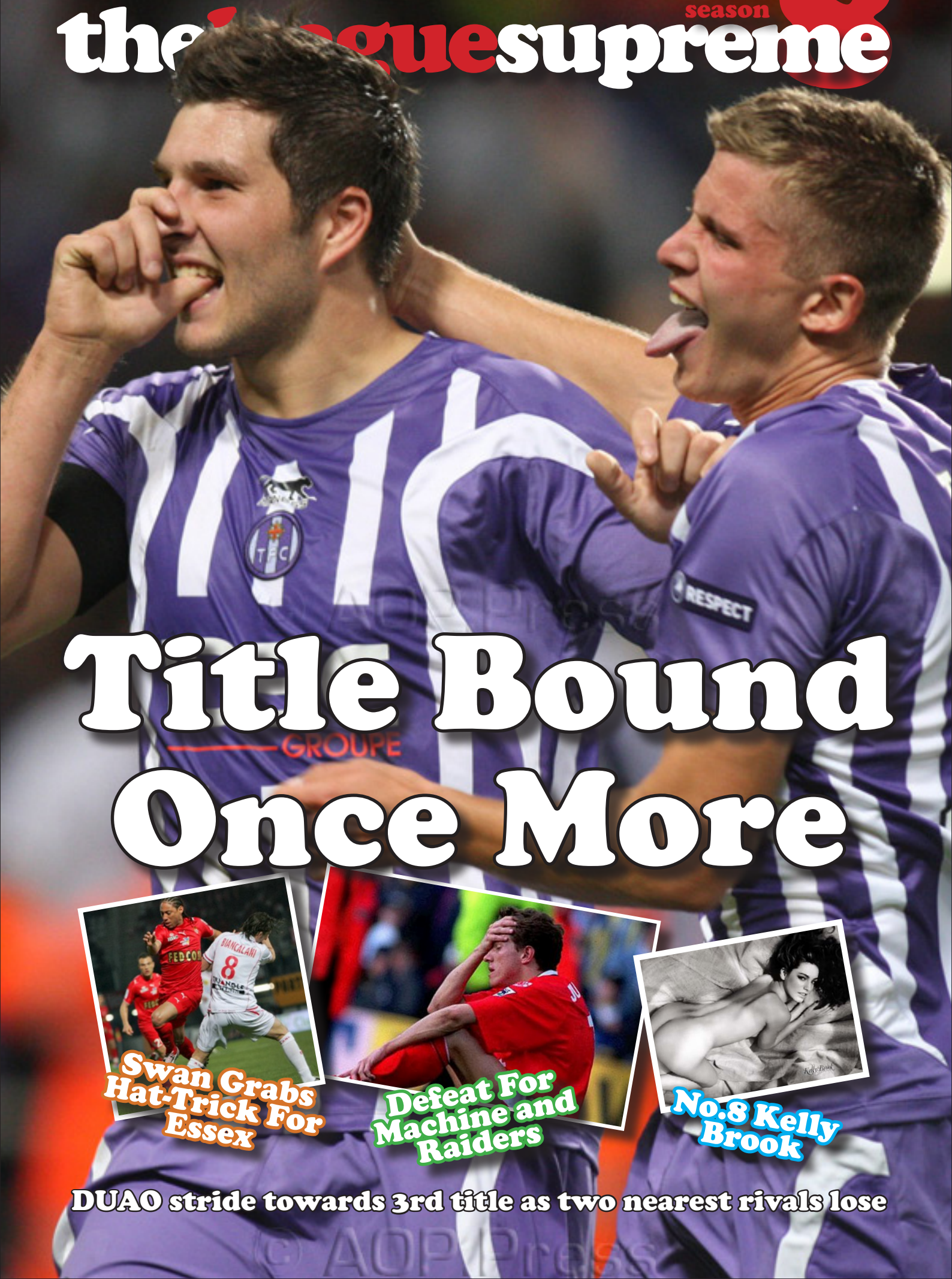


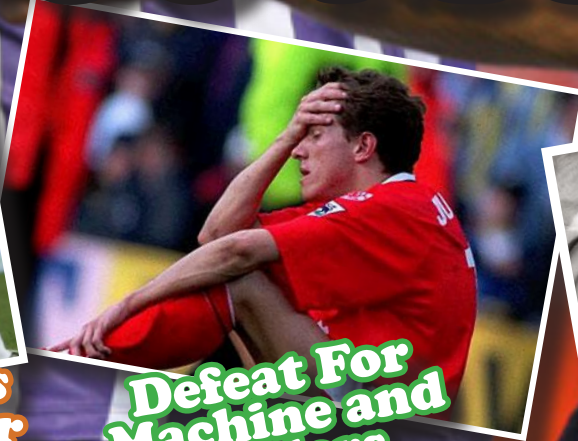

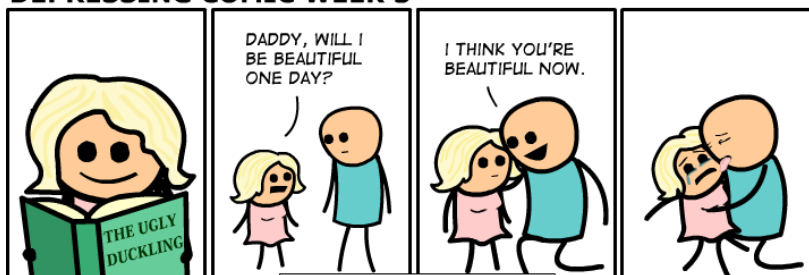
Parks 6 match winning streak came to a halt to a much improved Perry Men side with Egloshayle going down 2-1.

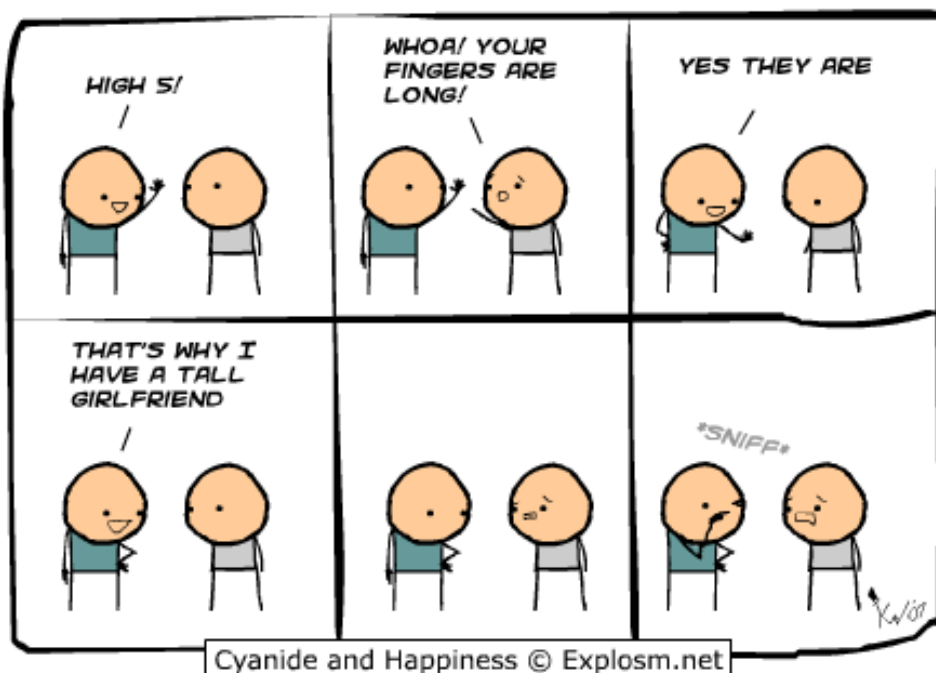

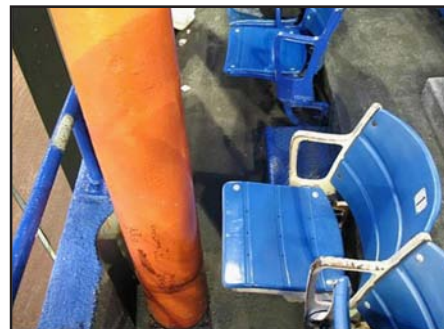
