Livid Red Machine FC manager refused to face the press after his side were quite simply out-played, in their recent 4-1 loss to Down By The Trent.


After the final whistle was blown, the away dressing was not the place to be. With a foul mouthed rant being aimed at the Machine's players.

DUAO Bounce Back


After a shaky start to the season, nothing short of a resounding home win would satisfy the DUAO faithful. Thankfully the

All at the Orpheum would like to wish Mr.Hargreaves and his wife all the best for the birth.


